The Principal (i/c) welcomed all the members of BOG for the meeting. The following resolutions were approved by the committee after discussion.

Action Taken Report:

- **Revised e-SAR submitted to NBA:**
 - EEE, ECE & CSE has applied for accreditation. The e-SAR which was submitted earlier was updated and submitted on 22.08.2014. Five sets of dates are given and awaiting for the committee visit.
- **SEED Grant:**
 - On 30th July 2014 twenty eight student projects short listed by the Principal & HODs. Those projects were presented before the panel headed by Dr.U.Chandrasekhar (Senior Research Adviser of GCE, Bargur). Finally 12 projects were selected for funding. All the projects are eligible for seed grant.
- **Anna University Affiliation:**
 - Anna University, Chennai has constituted a team for granting the affiliation to the Govt. Engineering colleges. The team visited the college on

17.09.2014 and inspected the departments for infrastructure and staff availability. The report is awaited.

- On grant of affiliation for 2014-15 the same will be sent to UGC for getting Autonomy.

- **ICT enabled classes:**

- Anna Edusat, QEEE classes (IIT) and A-View classes (Anna University, Chennai) are live streamed to the respective students including first years. Separate time table is created for these ICT enabled classes.

- **Pilot Survey:**

- NPIU& M/S Infova consultancy have conducted Faculty, Student satisfaction survey on 28th Aug 2014 in this institute. 1024 out of 1027 (99.7%) students and staff took part in the survey. NPIU has appreciated the work and invited the college officials for presentation at Bangalore to share how this high turnout is achieved in the institute.


